	The circumstances of the breach were reviewed by an independent expert who determined that (i) the CLA Senior Associate's role in the audits was limited to supervision and guidance of CLA's engagement team members working on the compliance exam, and (ii) the CLA Senior Associate did not directly perform tests relating to either audit. Nonetheless, because the CLA Senior Associate's role threatened CLA's independence and impacted the external audit team's integrity and objectivity, CLA could not cure the breach relative to the compliance audit. Accordingly, CLA notified the Illinois Auditor General it would resign from the 2021 compliance audit (which it has done) and would not issue a report. In view of the same, the Auditor General indicated that consistent with common practice, in 2023, it will conduct a two-year compliance audit of the Tollway, encompassing 2021 and 2022.
	With regard to the financial audit, it was concluded that the CLA Senior Associate's role only tangentially impacted the same, and CLA could properly complete the financial audit after taking certain curative steps, including
	(i) immediately removing the CLA Senior Associate from its audit team,
	(ii) tasking a team from another CLA office to redo any impacted or potentially impacted work related to the financial audit, and (iii) requesting that the Auditor General Audit Manager review the work the new CLA team re-performs.
	CLA and the Illinois Auditor General requested that the Tollway meet with them to discuss this matter and either concur or not concur with the determination that the curative steps, if successfully carried out, will have satisfactorily addressed the consequences of the independence breach.

Upon expiration of this term, the Treasurer may elect to extend this Agreement, for a period of time and terms agreed upon by the parties, that are consistent with the Treasurer's procurement regulations not to exceed a total term of ten (10) years.

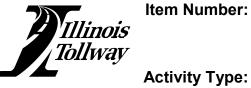

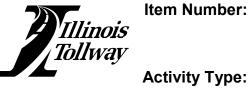

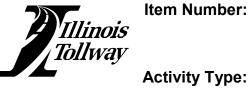

**Description:** Pilot Program Suspending Escalated Toll Evasion Fines

Scope: The Toll Highway Act authorizes the Illinois Tollway to "fix, assess, and collect civil fines for a vehicle's operation on a toll highway without the required toll having been paid." 605 ILCS 10/10(a-5). Pursuant to Section 10/10(a-5) of the Act, the Illinois Tollway previously established rules for, among other things, escalated fines, which are set forth in 92 Ill. Admin. Code §§ 2520.750(a) and (b). The escalated fine for toll violations on the Elgin-O'Hare Tollway (IL-390) is \$25.00 per violation. The escalated fine for toll violations on other Tollway toll roads is \$50.00 per violation.

The Joint Committee on Administrative Rules ("JCAR") authorized the Tollway's Board of Directors to establish a temporary pilot program suspending "the \$50 additional fine for any or all classes of vehicles ... for the time period specified in [a Board] Resolution." 92 Ill. Admin. Code § 2520.750(b)(2).

In order to reevaluate and optimize the Tollway's fine structure, and thereby better meet the needs of the Tollway and Tollway customers, the Tollway seeks to implement a three-year pilot program suspending imposition and collection of the escalated \$50 fines pursuant to Section 2520.750(b)(2) and suspending imposition and collection of the escalated \$25 fines pursuant to Section 10(a-5) of the Toll Highway Act. The proposed program will be retroactive to July 1, 2022 and will terminate on June 30, 2025. Prior to termination of the program, the Board will determine whether to discontinue, modify or continue its escalated fine policy and will amend its rules to reflect its decision. *See* 92 Ill. Admin. Code § 2520.750(b)(2).
