**Description:** Violation Enforcement Program Services

**Scope:** By Resolution No. 22265, dated June 24, 2021, the Board authorized the Tollway to enter into a contract with Professional Account Management, LLC (“PAM”) for violation enforcement program services, including collection of both toll-related and non-toll-related debt.

There are no direct costs to the Tollway for PAM’s collection services. Instead, PAM remits all recovered tolls to the Tollway and, as part of a revenue share structure, PAM retain a portion of all other recovered revenue as a success fee. Specifically, PAM retains 13% of any collected fees and fines relating to toll debt and 17.5% of any non-toll related debt collections. As a result, the Tollway receives 100% of any tolls collected, 87% of any toll-related fees and fines collected, and 82.5% of any non-toll-related debt PAM collects.

Based on evidence of PAM’s unsustainable cost structure relative to the violation enforcement program, the Tollway’s substantial investment in the implementation of the program, the Tollway’s historic costs to run a similar program, the collection delay that would occur to replace the program, and other factors, staff requests approval to agree to PAM’s request to increase PAM’s revenue share of collected toll-related fees and fines from 13% up to 37% for the balance of the current contract term, which ends on August 17, 2026. The revenue share for non-toll related debt will remain the same. *(Scope continued on page 3.)*
