An image reviewer is then presented with a screen that includes a photo, or multiple photos, of a vehicle and license plate, along with an Optical Character Recognition (OCR) read of the license plate. The image reviewer must compare the photo images with the OCR information, and subsequently, accept or reject the image. The image reviewer also determines and records in the system the license plate jurisdiction, including the license plate type. *(Scope continued on page 3.)*

The Tollway maintains a program that seeks reimbursement from toll violators and has enacted administrative rules, approved by the Illinois General Assembly, to establish and operate a Violation Enforcement System.

Additionally, Bridgeway is responsible for hiring, training, and managing the image reviewers. Finally, Bridgeway serves as a key partner in the Tollway's multi-layered monitoring of electronic tolling effectiveness, alerting us to any image issues that might signal technology problems at the lane level.

Without these vital image review services, subsequent activities of notice generation, printing, and collection of payments are not possible.
