The Tollway is required to use this contract for banking services including depository services, check-clearing services, information reporting, wire and ACH transfers, purchased rolled-coin services, re-verification of coin bags deposited, and armored car delivery services.

This renewal request will therefore amend Resolution No. 20663 dated 4/23/15 by increasing the upper limit of compensation by \$350,000.00 for an additional one-year period.
